

# THANKYOU

A very big thank you to everyone who participated in our whānau survey. As promised TLC will donate \$5 to Heart Kids for every response. Although the deadline has passed for inclusion in this report of the results, we always welcome feedback.

In summary, 100% of respondents value good teacher to child ratios as being important to quality of care. 96% of you value warm, caring and respectful teachers as being key to quality of care, and 100% of you find TLC's teachers VERY caring and respectful. And, you report that 75% of your children are Very Happy at TLC, and 25% are Mostly Happy. As TLC's licensee, I would like to thank our teaching team for this result. I could not ask for a better team.

In terms of communications, it sounds like monthly articles on various educational topics would be really appreciated, as well as the less frequent TLCZines. It looks like we have some work to do to raise the profile of our wonderful Parent Voice Committee, the great work they do, and contribution they make.

 I have taken to heart the comments about making upstairs look more homely, as this is a core value of ours. I will take this to the team, and plan to make this happen this year. I am aware, that some of the 'softer' resources get put away during Covid-19 Levels 2-4, as they are harder to sanitise on a daily basis. We DO have plans to replace the carpet, it has lasted an amazing 14 years. My preference would be to have wooden floors and rugs. This is a big project though, and timing is the challenge.

It is wonderful to see your aspirations for your children, and I am so very grateful that these are a beautiful match with TLC's philosophy and values. Let us all work as a community towards Te Whārki's (our curriculum) aspirational statement:

Competent and confident learners and communicators, healthy in mind, body and spirit, secure in their sense of belonging and in the knowledge that they make a valued contribution to society.

- A monthly short-ish post on a specific topic would be preferable over a newsletter. All the regular updates on staff movement, sickness etc should be as often as needed ie not limited

- our daughter does in the day. More photos would be good, as well as more individual stories.
- Newsletters/zines are great but I appreciate a lot of work goes into them so producing them regularly must be a challenge. A monthly post on a topic would be great. We love getting stories/photos on Educa.



- Think the outdoor area is fabulous especially the gardening area up top. A mini sports zone for the older exuberant kids would be great so they can bounce balls, shoot a mini basketball hoop, use chalk for hopscotch, 4 square etc.

- The cubby holes could be moved from the thoroughfare downstairs as creates an area of congestion More climbing equipment. Less mosquitos somehow
- The spaces indoor and out are excellent. Noise downstairs can be an issue given the large continuous space.
- I think the downstairs space is excellent, very age appropriate. I think the kakano room feels a bit sparse, it would be nice if it was more homely. Family photos on the walls? Artwork? Some soft furnishings (as appropriate) Plants? A small bookshelf? I know they're little, but our son loves looking at books already...
- Access to nature play grass, plants etc.

- Maybe some outings or some more education sessions like the ambulance lady

- So caring & respectful, observant, thoughtful, warm, loving, genuine, authentic, present, you really take the time to be with the children.




- Great staff, very kind, respectful and knowledgeable. Love the unstructured free play environment

# 9.WHY DID YOU CHOOSETLC?




- RIE Continuity care
